The Candidate for Confirmation may wish to consult with their school for service project opportunities, and Holy Name Parish.

IN TERMS OF SERVICE/STEWARDSHIP REQUIREMENTS, PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING:

- ➤ 20 hours of service are required (some of these hours may have been completed over the summer months-2017-, for example: "Safety Town", babysitting, helping an elderly neighbor by mowing their lawn all summer, etc.
- The 20 hours may be dedicated to one project or many projects.
- > The Candidate for Confirmation may NOT have been paid for the service rendered.
- > The 20 hours must be completed before March 5, 2018.
- The sheet marked: "Confirmation Stewardship Reflection Questions" is DUE: March 5, 2018. An interview for Confirmation will not be scheduled if both the twenty hours have not been fulfilled, and the reflection sheet has not been submitted.

- > Do errands for the home-bound or elderly neighbors or family members
- Cut the grass for elderly neighbor
- Shovel snow for an elderly neighbor
- Help a technology challenged person feel more comfortable navigating their computer
- Write notes of encouragement and support to those preparing for the celebration of a sacrament
- Help around the house w/o being asked
- Participate in "Safety Town" during the Summer
- Serve as a Camp Counselor
- Volunteer at Vacation Bible School
